Here is some useful information for someone starting out on their first Atari, whether or not it's your first experience with a computer.

The following book is the best introductory book out for being "user friendly." It was written by someone who is used to training people on the machines, and the author has really covered the field, including graphics and sound. The illustrating programs are blessedly brief. It's full of pictures AND humor, which is a blessing:

INSIDE ATARI BASIC by Bill Carris
Published by Reston Publishing Co.

AFTER the above book, or if you already have it, this next one is an excellent all-round book for the Atari. It has lots on BASIC programming, with illustrating programs that are useful, several chapters on graphics and sound, as well as disk drives, recorders, data files, printers, etc., etc.

> YOUR ATARI COMPUTER by Lon Poole, et al.
> Published by Osborne/McGraw-Hill, about \$16, 458 pages (In most large book stores)

A great way to eke out the gaps in software...anything from games to utilities, educational programs, business, etc., is APX. It's user-written programs marketed through one major and three supplementary catalogs a year. Just call the following numbers to obtain these free:

ATARIWRITER is the new word processing software now available from Atari. There are a number of differences between the old ATARI word processing program and the new ATARIWRITER.

The new ATARIWRITER software is considered FILE oriented, while the old word processing program is considered page oriented. The formatting and paginating time with a lengthy document is greatly reduced over the old word processing program, because ATARIWRITER formats a document as it prints.

ATARIWRITER is available in cartridge form, not diskette, so document files can be saved to cassette as well as to diskette. This means more memory is available to write and edit with. ALSO, no more worries about the Master disk going bad! It may be used with either the Atari 400, 300 or 1200XL Computer.

Even though ATARIWRITER has a 40 column screen output, it compensates for this limitation with a unique print preview feature. Print preview allows the user to view the 30 column format on the screen before the document is printed. The use of the ESCAPE key anytime during the writing/editing of a document will take the user back to the menu with no harm to the file or system. Also, the SYSTEM RESET key can be used to return the user to the program menu with no harm to the file or system.

ATARIWRITER is extremely user-friendly and is compatible with any non-ATARI parallel printer. The user can easily insert the control codes for their printer anywhere into the text, thus giving them all the special functions of their non-ATARI printer. This puts an end to printer/program incompatibility. Also, the ATARIWRITER can be merged with document files from the old ATARI word processing program.

The ATARIWRITER cartridge is currently available and retails for approximately \$79. In essence, ATARIWRITER is a powerful, easy to use word processing system for home and business use...at a cost affordable to all!
