

MEMORY CARD MANUAL

Parts of the Memory Card



Before Using the Memory Card

This Memory Card requires a lithium battery to preserve data written to the card. Insert the lithium battery (CR-2016) or equivalent before using the Memory Card.

1. Inserting the lithium battery

Note: Since battery replacement MUST be done when the memory or program card is fully inserted into the Portfolio (otherwise you will lose stored data), it is good practice to install the first battery in a blank card in the following way:

- Insert card into unit. Follow guides for loading on card label.
- Find groove for removing battery holder (top right rear edge of card).
- c. Pull out holder. Place CR-2016 or equivalent lithium battery with (+) DOWN into holder. Slide holder back into card.

Caution: If plus (+) side is not facing DOWN, data will not be preserved.

2. Write-protect switch


When the write-protect switch is set to ON, data in the Memory Card is protected and cannot be over-written. Set the switch to OFF to write new data to the card, but keep it ON at all other times.

3. Replacing the lithium battery

The life of the lithium battery depends on the amount of data in memory and usage temperatures. Battery life is shortened by high temperatures over 112°F (40°C). To prevent loss of data, replace the lithium battery with the same type (CR-2016) or equivalent when the following terms expire:

32 kilobytes — 2 years 64 kilobytes — 1 year 128 kilobytes — 1 year

Caution: Data in the Memory Card will be lost if the lithium battery is simply removed from the card. Always replace the lithium battery while the card is inserted in the main unit and the unit's power is on.
